### Swim4Life Child Drowning Prevention Program

With the dedication of Rotarians and helpers from the Samui community our Swim4Life program continues at the International School of Samui. Project Background:- In 2020 the World Health Organization reported that Thailand was "number one" for child deaths by drowning in ASEAN. In fact, the WHO said that the country's child death by drowning rate was twice as high as the world's average! In the preceding years of Covid lockdowns and school closures its generally accepted that this situation has got worse not better. That's an average of about 1,262 child deaths from drowning per year - a shocking 5 kids per day!!

## **Community Outreach Program**

Fud is a bright happy 13 year old boy who suffers from Osteogenesis Imperfecta (commonly knows as brittle bones) a condition which is not curable. This means that he has less bone mass and less bone strength and an increased risk of sudden and unexpected bone fractures.

Under the supervision of a nurse from <u>Smile Coconut Healthcare</u> Fud is taken for a series of recommended bisphosphonate therapy treatments to strengthen his bones and has now this month Fud been accepted for full time education for the first time in his life!!









# Food4Life supported by Rotary Club of Plutaluang and Disaster Aid Thailand

Last week we completed the distribution of almost 2,000 fortified meals to 2 needy communities on Samui. The first group of 52 poor Burmese/ Nepalese families are based around the Nepalese Temple area. The second group of 52 needy Thai families that live in the tin shack shanty town that tourists never see just a few kilometers form Chaweng's golden beaches.

This much welcomed food relief was provided by <u>Disaster Aid Thailand</u> and <u>Disaster Aid International</u> made possible by a joint venture between our own <u>Food4Life Program</u> initiated during the dire period caused by Covid and RISE AGAINST HUNGER which is an ongoing project for Disaster Aid Thailand, headed by the <u>Rotary Club of Plutaluang D.3340</u> led by PP. Capt. Dol Adinan and supported by Disaster Aid International based in Malaysia and headed by

PP. KK looi who is also Past Chairman of DAI (Disaster Aid International) and DAM (<u>Disaster Aid Malaysia</u>)

While the dark days of Covid lockdowns are thankfully behind us tourism related industry is far from back to pre-Covid levels. 2019 saw close to 40 million arrivals in the Kingdom but this year this year approx. 10 million are expected. Behind the statistics is the livelihoods of everyone on an island such as this. From cooks and cleaners to doctors and nurses. From boat captains and bus drivers to bank managers and wedding planners. Simply put there is no other industry or avenue of employment that is not effected by tourism.
